She adds,' With the full roll-out of Universal Credit arriving in Kirklees before the end of the year, we are expecting increased numbers to be using our services and want to be prepared. Hence our latest recruitment drive.'

So what is it really like to be a volunteer with Kirklees Citizens Advice & Law Centre? Sam Heaton, 37, of Dewsbury Moor joined Citizens Advice as a Social Policy/Campaigns Volunteer in September 2016.
